1.0 Purpose

1.1 To promote environmental cleanliness, safety and image of the community through the removal of junk around the campsites and properties within Wahnapitae First Nation.

2.0 Definitions

Member: Means any person who is a member of Wahnapitae First Nation and is

listed on the membership Band list set out by the Indian Act.

Council: Means the duly elected Chief and Council of Wahnapitae First Nation.

Junk: Means old or discarded vehicles, structures, and items that pose a risk to

the members & visitors of Wahnapitae First Nation and/or the surrounding

environment.

3.0 Procedure

- 3.1 Upon identification of junk by the Lands Department, Lands must attempt to notify the owner of the junk. If the Owner can not be reached/found a posting will be made on the Wahnapitae First Nation website.
- 3.2 Upon attempted notification, the Owner of the junk will have a thirty (30) day grace period to remove any belongings from the junk. If the junk is on Band land this grace period is 72 hours.
- 3.3 After the grace period the Lands Department will come and remove the junk from the owners' property and issue a fine.
- After a appropriate amount of junk has been gathered at the Wahnapitae First Nation landfill site, the Lands Department will contact the appropriate company to come in and remove the junk from the landfill site at the same time to save on costs.

4.0 Enforcement

- 4.1 This policy is enforceable by the Wahnapitae First Nation Administration Lands Department.
- 4.2 All residents (year-round and seasonal) as well as businesses of Wahnapitae First Nation are subjected to clauses of policy.
- 4.3 Fines will be determined based on environmental damage and size of the junk.

5.0 Amendments

5.1 This policy can be amended by the Chief and Council at any time at a duly convened meeting with a majority vote.

6.0 Review

6.1 This policy will be reviewed every 2 year(s) by the Lands Department who will make any necessary recommendations to the Council.
