01. (k)w-ling: of the place of the stone (in a lake).
 02. Saw-gi-hay-gong-sing: of the place of the low (not all lake names require this name).
 03. Saw-gi-hay-gong-sing: of the place of the small lake or pond.
 04. Zee-sing: of the place of the sea.
 05. Zee-sing-ling: of the place of a small stream or river.
 06. Waw-ling: of the place of the bay (in a lake).
 07. Hay-ak: of the place of the point on land.
 08. Waw-shi-ga-mong: of the place of the hill.
 09. Waw-waw-ling: of the place of the rapids (in a river).
 010. On-gan-ning: of the place of the winter canoe or stage (where possible most all these names were also good for use as winter travel routes, or trails).
 011. Waw-bi-low-ik-kway-awg: of the place of the winter trail (these trails were designed exclusively for winter travel by snowshoe, sledge and toboggan).
